See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? Isaiah 43:19

We always look forward to spring in this part of the world. After experiencing a hard Western New York winter, we're all so happy to see the arrival of warmer temperatures, green grass, and more daylight. Spring brings a unique sense of newness and freshness, unlike other seasons.

This time of year also fills us with joy because it is the Easter season. In the church, Easter begins with the celebration of Jesus' resurrection and goes until Pentecost, when the Holy Spirit comes into the world in a new way. Both of these concepts also show us ideas of new life. The season of Lent prepares us for the death and resurrection of Jesus through a time of reflection and discipline. We appreciate the celebration of life renewed at Easter more because of the journey, similar to the feelings we experience at the first signs of spring after winter.

We've all heard the old saying April showers bring May flowers.

Although most of us would prefer to skip the showers, we know they are necessary for the flowers to bloom. Similarly, the sacrifices we endure to help us develop a deeper appreciation of Jesus' holiness and discipline develop our Christlike character. Now that Lent is over, it's important to remember that it was always a means to a greater end. We shouldn't lose sight of the reason for our sacrifices. God was doing a new thing in us, and we should cherish God and God's work in our lives.

The verse from Isaiah is part of a passage where God is helping the nation of Israel understand that God is about to do something that the world hasn't seen. God will move in their lives in ways they can't imagine yet. It parallels the miraculous way God works in Christ. Most of us would never perceive that God would save us by breaking the power of sin and death through the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus.

As we recognize the love of Christ and seek to love Him in return, our hope becomes to love others like He does. Changing to be more like Jesus is always difficult. Although the change may have been tough at the start, hopefully, it's easier now. You've come through the rain. Even if the flowers aren't in full bloom, you can probably see spouts.

Even if it wasn't an intentional time of growth like Lent, our spiritual winters lead to spring in our souls just like the natural seasons do. Death becomes resurrection. If you're in a difficult season, remember that seasons change. God continues to do new things. They will spring forth in your life even if you can't perceive them yet. Spring is a time when we see so much new life. Having come through Lent into this Easter season, celebrate the new thing that God is doing in you.

Remember that He is Risen! He is risen indeed! It changes everything!


Financial Highlights

- February income was \$48,543 (\$4,128 higher than the February budgeted income
 of \$44,325)
- February actual YTD income is \$7,111 higher than the comparable income for February 2023
- February expenses were \$56,350 (\$2,061 higher than the budgeted expenses of \$54,289)
- February actual expenses were \$7,808 more than the actual income.
- Over the past few months, Pastor Jennifer and volunteers have worked in the cold tirelessly at the concession stands for some of the Buffalo Bills games. Their hard work and dedication to raising funds for our Church has generated an additional \$9,527 income!!! Way to go!! (This amount was not considered in the 2024 budget; therefore is in addition to the February income listed above of \$48,543)

Our expenses are much higher in the first few months of each year, so this is nothing new. Like many of you, we are feeling the strain of inflation. However, we do need to generate consistent income every month to ensure it allows us to support and fund all of our ministries. We will continue to keep a close watch on our spending and income.

Our faith in God reminds us that He is with us and will continue to guide us. As Christians, we consider it part of our discipleship to give an offering to God through the church. We know that we can't be the strong church we have been without your help, and we depend upon your generosity!

On the next few pages you can read the Thankful Moments from some of those who attended this year's retreat. Please take the time to read through them to see the way God is moving through this ministry!

This year's Youth Retreat was absolutely amazing. But if you're unsure of what a "youth retreat" is, let me tell you. So, every year, our church's youth goes on a trip to Camp Findley for a weekend, usually around January. It is a time where we all grow closer to God together through many things, such as prayer stations, communion, devotions, "God Moments," and games.

But now on to my experience. To start, I never was bored on the Youth Retreat as we were always busy. I also got to spend time with the people I usually don't talk to as much at church, which was nice. But most importantly, I grew closer to God and that wasn't just temporary. After the Youth Retreat, I have been reading my bible and praying a lot more than I usually do.

Finally, some of my God Moments. A "God Moment" is any time you feel like God is with you. The first one is when I feel like God led me and a couple friends to a storage room that nobody knew about, filled with so much stuff that made the weekend a lot more entertaining. The second one was when a friend was still asleep when we were supposed to be just about ready for breakfast and downstairs. But everyone was just going to let him sleep through it. If you asked me to pick my favorite part of the youth retreat I would not be able to pick one thing. But the most memorable parts would be playing our own version of baseball downstairs, snow tubing, the prayer stations, and everyone's devotions. That was my experience at the 2024 Youth Retreat, and I am looking forward to next year's Youth Retreat.



After going on my second youth retreat with this group of people, I realized something. Without one person being there, everything changes. Everyone who told a story, helped each other have fun, or even planned the trip had a special part that only they could play. Everyone made a difference. 
Madison

I was going up the mountain and I was looking around and saw all of us having fun together. I realized that even though we were all running around and having fun, we were all still. I realized that we all have chaos in our individual lives, and this weekend gave us a chance to leave our chaos and focus on him and each other.

The most important God moment was the prayer stations. We have done prayer stations the last few years, and it is always a special moment. Prayer stations are always a special moment where you can feel God, and it feels like he is sitting right next to you. They really allow you to open up and just focus on what he is trying to tell you. It felt like God was right there speaking to me during the stations and helping me through the tough times that I was talking to him about. I was having a lot of doubts about my future and what he wanted from me. That night and even more now, he is showing me what he wants from me and that I am on the right track. The retreat weekend made me realize how important the relationships he gives you are and how special the retreat is.

Each retreat, each conversation, and each prayer has been a step towards becoming the person I am today: a person grounded in faith, driven by love, and committed to living a life with God at the center.

As I carry the memories and lessons of these retreats into adulthood, I am deeply thankful for the safe space that allowed me to question, learn, and grow. I am grateful for the leaders who guided me, the peers who walked beside me, and God who never left my side.
