Jesus called them together and said, "You know that the rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their high officials exercise authority over them. Not so with you. Instead, whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wants to be first must be your slave—just as the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many." Matthew 20:25-28

We're now on the other side of Christmas. Depending on when you read this, Epiphany may have passed, and the season will be officially over. So now what? Part of why the season means so much to many of us is because it passes so quickly (even if you can find candy canes and decorations at stores in August). Our awe and wonder at Almighty and sovereign God coming into our world to save us because He loves us shouldn't just go back into storage bins for the next eleven months. What will we do with what we learned and felt this Christmas season?

How does God factor into your plans for 2024? While few of us turn a physical page on a calendar anymore, the start of the new year still inspires most of us with a sense of fresh opportunity. As you've heard, we're starting some groups to help people take the next step in their faith journey. We'll discuss how to better understand the Bible, deepen your prayer life, and discern your gifts and call.

I say all of this about the lessons of Christmas and the opportunity that the new year brings to invite you to consider whether God might be calling you to something new. The scripture above reminds us that Jesus teaches us that the heart of loving is serving. It misses the point of Christmas to remember how God showed us love and not do anything about it. We might waste the gift of a new year by failing to dream and falling into the same patterns. Love has to be put into action.

This month, we will celebrate the ministry of all Christians at church during the coffee hours on January 20 and 21. Our ministry fair provides a chance to learn more about how you can serve with others in our congregation. There are opportunities to be in ministry with homeless people, prisoners, and others across all age groups. You might feel called to serve in an administrative role, such as our finance or building ministries. It will also be a wonderful way to meet other people in the church and strengthen relationships. Use this opportunity to see where God might be calling you.

Many Christmas stories end with a message that says we should keep the Spirit of Christmas all year long. As you think about how Jesus came into your world in a new way this Christmas, listen to him calling you to follow Him. Saying yes to Him might create your best year yet.

Jr. Church (9 AM service only) is a fun, interactive, and safe place where kids (3 years - 6th grade) can worship God and engage in their very own relationship with Him. Children can be dropped off in the Ark before worship and will stay through the entire service.

In December, we finished up our Heroes of the Nativity series. In this series, we looked at different characters of the nativity story each week, the story they have to share with us, and how they weren't alone in their journeys, and neither are we. God was with them every step of the way, showing His love, guiding them, and turning their faith into miraculous experiences. This curriculum taught us that when we trust God, we too can discover joy, love, and miracles in our everyday lives.

Shepherds: Humble Witnesses to the Glory of God (Luke 2:8-20)

Just like the shepherds, God reveals His love to us when we take the time to listen. The shepherds were ordinary people doing their job when they heard the incredible news of Jesus' birth. This shows us that even in our ordinary lives, God can do extraordinary things. When we listen and trust in God, we can experience His love and joy, just like the shepherds did.

Wise Men: Earnest Seekers of the Divine Promise Matthew 2:1-12)

The Wise Men were guided by God as they earnestly sought the newborn king. Their story teaches us that when we genuinely search for God in our lives and ask Him to guide our steps, He will lead us right to Him. It's through this earnest seeking that we can experience the love of Jesus, and when we find Him, like the Wise Men, we will be filled with joy.

Joseph: Steadfast Obedience in the Midst of Uncertainty (Matthew 1:18-24, Matthew 2:13-15)

Joseph's story shows us that God supports those who obey Him, even when it's challenging or doesn't make sense. Joseph trusted God's plan and followed His instructions, which led to him being a crucial part of Jesus' story. Similarly, when we obey God, we're saying we trust Him. It's through this trust that we can experience the love of Jesus and find joy, even in uncertain times.

Mary: Trusting God in the Midst of the Miraculous (Luke 1:26-38, Luke 2:19)

Mary was just an ordinary girl, but her trust in God led her to be part of the most extraordinary event in history: the birth of Jesus. Her story teaches us that when we trust God, even when things seem impossible, we can experience His miraculous love. This trust opens us to the love of Jesus and brings joy into our lives.

Jesus: The Greatest Gift of God's Love (Luke 2:1-7, John 3:16)

Jesus' birth, the central event in the Nativity story, shows us that Jesus is the greatest gift of God's love. His coming to earth as a baby, growing up to die for our sins, demonstrates God's immense love for us. Through Jesus, we can experience forgiveness and form a deep relationship with Him. When we realize this gift, it brings us the greatest joy of all.




With the youth doing the whole meal, we won't need any additional help in the kitchen for January's meal.
