As they entered the tomb, they saw a young man dressed in a white robe sitting on the right side, and they were alarmed. "Don't be alarmed," he said. "You are looking for Jesus the Nazarene, who was crucified. He has risen! He is not here. See the place where they laid him. But go, tell his disciples and Peter, 'He is going ahead of you into Galilee. There you will see him, just as he told you."

Mark 16:5-7

Are you a "last word" person? Some folks believe that a discussion or argument is over only if they have the final word. Even if the facts don't support their position or their argument doesn't hold up, having that last word matters to them. Speaking that last sentence gives them a sense of victory in the moment. A lot of folks can't handle not having the final word.


Guess what? The truth is that we don't get the final word on much of our lives. We all deal with situations and issues that are beyond our control. These things come, and we don't get the final say about when they end. However, that's not always a bad thing. Imagine your life if your worst moment spoke for your entire life. In other words, it had the final word. If you see death as having the final word on your life, you would live very differently. It's almost cruel to experience life without hope and grace.

As I am writing this, Lent has just started. By the time you read it, we will already be well into the Holy season, as we look forward to the time when we remember the death and resurrection of Jesus. Having been in the church for a while, it is common to hear leaders say that the end of a person's life is not the end of their story. This is possible because of what Jesus did for us. Sin does not have the final say over us, because Jesus died on the cross for us. Death does not have the final say over us, because He rises again in victory.

Are you currently facing a situation that seems difficult to overcome? As disciples of Jesus, sometimes we may feel hopeless or fearful because of the challenges we encounter. Certain situations are beyond our control. However, when we live as people of the resurrection, knowing that our God has the final say, we can confront any obstacle with unwavering faith. This does not mean that we deny the pain, confusion, anxiety, or anger that we may experience due to our circumstances. We should allow ourselves to feel heartbroken if we lose a relationship, grieve when a loved one passes away, or become angry at injustices we encounter. But, we should also understand that these moments are different when we acknowledge the truth and power of God being with us. The God who raised Jesus from the dead loves us and will guide us through every storm that we face.

Live as a person of resurrection. You are a child of Almighty God. Neither sin, death, or any other problem on earth has real power over you. Be a witness to what Jesus Christ has done. Let your life tell a story of His victory and His love.

GriefShare

Thursdays Beginning March 7 at 6:30 PM, Connection Room 2

GriefShare is a safe, welcoming place where people understand the difficult emotions of grief. Over 13 weeks, you'll find relief and comfort as you learn what to expect in the days ahead and how to navigate your personal grief process. Since there are no neat, orderly stages of grief, you'll learn helpful ways of coping with grief, in all its unpredictability - and gain solid support each step of the way.

Topics include how to manage grief-related emotions such as loneliness, anxiety, sadness, anger, and regret; how to cope with the changes in your life and relationships; how to recognize what's normal in grief; and what to do if you feel stuck or hopeless. At a weekly GriefShare meeting, you will view a video featuring respected counselors, teachers, and healthcare professionals on grief-related topics. After that is a small-group discussion for sharing, support, and personal application of what you learned in the video. You will receive a book to take home filled with valuable exercises for navigating your personal grieving process.

Income:

Projected Income: \$49,933 Actual Income: \$45,451

Expenses

Budgeted Expenses: \$61,660 Actual Expenses: \$63,711

- January actual income is \$4,482 LOWER than the projected income
- January actual expenses are \$2,051 HIGHER than our budgeted expenses
- January actual income is \$18,259 below expenses: We incur several seasonal or non-recurring expenses in January (e.g., town & county taxes, insurance policies, licenses, snow plowing, parking lot salting, fire protection systems, etc.). Our expenses are much higher in the first few months of each year, so this is nothing new. However, we need to generate consistent monthly income to ensure it allows us to support and fund all of our ministries. Hopefully, we will bounce back in February and March when those non-recurring expenses aren't a factor. We will continue to keep a close watch on our spending and income.

Our faith in God reminds us that He is with us and will continue to guide us. As Christians, we consider it part of our discipleship to give an offering to God through the church. We know that we can't be the strong church we have been without your help, and we depend upon your generosity! Your continued support is sincerely appreciated during these challenging times as we proceed with the ministry ahead of us, continuing to reach out to people everywhere in the name of Jesus Christ.

Thank you for all the support you give to God's work at Pendleton Center Church. We need to work hard to provide all the support our dynamic ministries need, and your continued help will make our ministry a powerful witness to Christ.

Over the last month, we had two different lessons that we looked at.

In our first lesson, Misquoted, we looked at Bible verses that are often misunderstood or misquoted. Then, we learned about a few different tools we can use to help us properly understand the scriptures we read. The first one was to read the verse by itself and then read the verses around it. Getting a verse's bigger picture and context can help us understand it. We also discussed how to research and dig deeper into verses by looking at reliable sources. Finally, the youth were challenged to find verses together as a group that are misquoted, and once they found one, they took time together to write the verse down, write down what the verse is commonly known for, and then what it actually means.

March meetings Sundays 3/3, 3/17 and 3/24 from 6:00-8:30 PM. In our second lesson, The Power of Words, we talked about how our tongues are powerful. We began our lesson by having a few volunteers squeeze out an entire tube of toothpaste and then asked them to put it back inside the tube. Our words are similar to that toothpaste; it's easy to speak words, but not so easy to take them back. As Christians, we should be careful of what we say to someone and always make sure we think before we speak. The words that we speak can bring death or life to someone. We also discussed how we should always encourage and uplift others with our words, take time to apologize when we have said something mean or hurtful, and watch what goes into our minds because what goes into our minds tends to always find a way back out eventually.

They were challenged to take time to think and evaluate the books, movies, music, social media, and anything else that they fill their hearts and minds with, and to make sure they are keeping God first.

We also worked on a mission project of preparing eggs for the Easter Celebration and Egg Hunt, and, of course, we went on our Winter Youth Retreat! Be sure to check in next month to hear about the Youth Retreat!
