And especially because we know our faults, we need to forgive people who are trying to make their lives a blessing instead of a curse. People who regret their sins and are living into grace. God forgives us, forgets our sins, and He can make our lives a fragrant blessing.

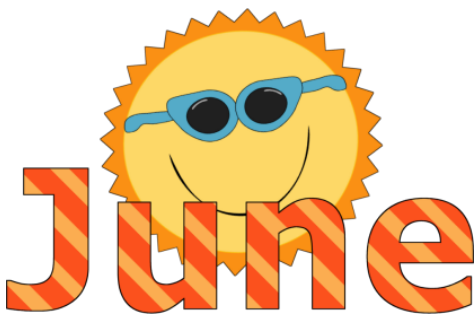
