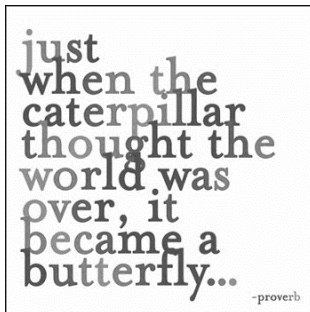
From the Pastor's Desk

"I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener. He cuts off every branch in me that bears no fruit, while every branch that does bear fruit he prunes so that it will be even more fruitful. Remain in me, as I also remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine." John 15

The Christian church around us is changing quickly. In many places it appears God is cutting off branches that are not bearing fruit. In others, God is pruning branches so they will be fruitful and grow. Either way, churches are changing. Our goal is to be part of the pruning so we can grow healthy fruit and be blessed by God.

Things are changing at our church. We are looking closely at how to enhance the ability of all our people to love God with their Heart, Soul, Mind and Strength. We have a great church! However, I have heard a number of concerns that we are a little too active, and often we are asking people to choose between loving God with your Heart, or your Mind, or your Soul, or your Strength. This is especially true for our children and teens. We are a strong ministry, however too often our resources are spread out and dispersed in such a way they no longer have the dynamic impact God wants us to have.

So we are looking to provide a better experience with a few less options and expectations.



Just like branches on a vine need pruning, so does a ministry. Over the last few years we have developed attitudes and activities that draw us off mission. These are not bad things. We even enjoy a lot of these things. But, year after year we have been drifting as we slowly become less fruitful. Ministries can look strong and healthy, but be like a grapevine that is all leaves and no fruit. Our church is still an amazing church. But it can be much better. Most of what you have loved about our church will still be there, but we intend that we will be more focused and more targeted to achieve the results God expects from us. That's what pruning does for a vine.

Our staff design is changing. We now have a Vision Team in place to help guide our ministry. This includes myself, Gidget Hughes leading our Nurture Ministries, Pastor Sherry Mahar leading our worship ministries, and Debbie Parise providing leadership for our business ministries. Many of our other staff are being redeployed to better serve our church.

Please pray for our church. God's leadership is the most essential thing we are seeking. Be open, but also be honest. If you like something, let us know, if you don't, let us know, if you're not sure, give it a chance.

As I said before, most of the changes are to adjust what we do and make our ministry more effective. You will notice change, but our goal is that everything our church should be will remain and thrive. Pruning leads to growth and to fruit. So long as we stay connected to the vine, which is Christ, God will give us the growth.

Summer Adult Bible Study

The Wednesday Evening Summer Bible Study will be held July 12 through August 9 at 7pm in the Fellowship Hall. We will look at the Old Testament book of Ezra, which tells the story of the rebuilding of the Temple in Jerusalem, the beginning of the return to Israel of the Jews who were sent into exile in Babylon, and the ministry of Ezra who was a descendant of Moses' brother Aaron, the chief priest. It is a story of the boldness of the Israelites who, in the midst of people they feared and who hindered their work at every turn, persevered and rebuilt a life for themselves in their homeland with God's help. This story teaches Christians today to remember who we are in a world that lives very differently from the way God calls us to live. As usual, a different pastor will be leading the study each week, and we're not telling who's teaching when. So come and be surprised and blessed by this time in God's Word.

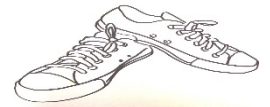
Opportunities to be in Service

Mission Moments: *These are always optional and up to you!* A few weeks each month we highlight a “Mission Moment” when you have an opportunity to give to the charity or program that is featured. You are encouraged to give to those groups or programs that you are interested in or want to support as you feel led. **July 9** will be Lakeview Animal Sanctuary. This Pendleton group rescues and cares for all types of animals with the goal of placing them in forever homes. **August 6** is for our Vacation Bible School (August 7-11). **August 20** is for Back to School (see below) which helps disadvantaged children in our area prepare for the upcoming school year. Your offering will help purchase items not donated.



Back to School Ministries for Children – We can work together to meet the needs of children, here at our church and children in Niagara Falls. Families may be struggling to find the money for that long list of supplies needed to start the school year. The Guardians is Pendleton Center Church’s connection for those who are caring for and helping elderly loved ones at the stage of life when they are most in need of loving care and often protection. People in this situation get together and talk about their experiences dealing with all kinds of issues that affect the elderly and those caring for them. At some gatherings there is a program to address a specific topic. But most often it is a time of sharing experiences, hearing how others handled similar situations, and praying and encouraging one another. Our Church Finances

How are we doing? This article was written in mid-June, when we only had financial results through the end of May. Our May year-to-date income was about 1.6% above the comparable figure last year. Another positive indicator is our current income projections for the year are about 1% above our 2017 finance budget. We will continue to keep a close watch on our spending and income. We appreciate your generosity in helping us to meet our expenses, as well as your special offerings toward our mission moments.

Electronic Giving – A Simple, Generous Choice: Would you find it helpful to have your offerings debited directly from your bank account as you probably do with other obligations? PCUMC offers electronic giving for those of you who wish to have contributions transferred electronically to the church's account. The church expenses don't take a vacation during the summer! We still have to pay utilities, salaries, a mortgage and other ongoing expenses. Thank you again for all you do to make our church ministries happen. We need to work hard to provide all the support they need, and your continued support will make our ministry a powerful witness to Christ.

Tops and SCRIP Retailer Gift Cards – We've been participating in Tops Markets' "ca\$h for causes" program for 11 years now! This program has earned more than \$25,000 for Pendleton Center Church with over \$500,000 in Tops cards sales! This is a *great* fund raising opportunity for non-profit organizations like our church. Remember that PCUMC receives 5% from Tops cards sales while you get the full face value of the card.

Tops cards can be used for groceries, gasoline, and prescriptions at all Tops Friendly Markets. We have denominations of \$10, \$20, \$25, \$50 and \$100 for your convenience. We've already given out \$6,650 in rebates to our regular customers (\$20 Tops Card for every \$1,000 spent).
