FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

"For when one says, "I follow Paul," and another, "I follow Apollos," are you not mere human beings? What, after all, is Apollos? And what is Paul? Only servants, through whom you came to believe—as the Lord has assigned to each his task. I planted the seed, Apollos watered it, but God has been making it grow. So neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but only God, who makes thing grow." -1 Corinthians 3

We like to put our dreams and hopes in a person. We elect a president or governor and believe the government will change for the better or worse. So often we place our confidence in a particular leader, a teacher, a boss at work, or even our parents. In churches we sometimes place our hopes and dreams in a person we call pastor. We can even think that one person can make all the difference in the life of our church. The Corinthian church had great pastors: Apollos, Paul, and Peter. People got naturally attached to each of them. They placed their dreams and hopes in Paul who began the church, but he moved on and Peter came to preach to them. Then when Peter left, an exciting young pastor named Apollos came. They were great men, but Paul says, they were only men. And the church was a lot more than any of them. It was a team of people all working to build a ministry for God, and a church that let God build through them.

We have a great team as well. We have great pastors, CLM's, volunteers, and a supportive staff that work together to build our church, but change is coming. Our long term pastor, Jean, is leaving at the end of the month to serve another church. When change happens, it causes doubts, fears, and concerns. We begin to look for a person to fix things and make them stable again. We can sometimes confuse who our savior is and get distracted from God. Our salvation comes from God and our strength comes from each other. Each person does their part; one plants, another waters, and God can make it grow. And we are stronger when we work as a team. Something called synergy comes about when our work together is greater than what it would be separately. So we wish Pastor Jean great blessings where she is going, and we will pray for her. She is one of those special people we will treasure in our hearts like the Corinthian church treasured their pastors. And we will keep our focus on God who gives us growth, and we will keep our love for each other, so we can continue to see great ministry happen working as God's team together.

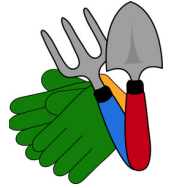
TOPS AND SCRIP RETAILER GIFT CARDS

FINANCE MINISTRIES

How are we doing? At the time this article was written, we only had financial results through the end of April. After the low income/high expense months of January and February, we were pleased to see our income step up a bit in March and increase even more in April. Our operating budget expenses were much lower in March and April as well, so our year-to-date expenses no longer exceed income (always a good thing!). Our budget income is basically running even with last year, even though we had an extra weekend of income through April last year. While the April 15 ice storm resulted in a very bad week for church income, our record high fish fry profit made a huge difference in the turnaround from February's disappointing results. Our current 2018 income projection is 2.1% above our finance budget, which is also a good sign. We will continue to keep a close watch on our spending and income, especially when considering the upcoming summer months usually generate lower income. We appreciate your generosity in helping us to meet our expenses, as well as your special offerings toward our mission moments.

Electronic Giving – A Simple, Generous Choice: Would you find it helpful to have your offerings debited directly from your bank account as you probably do with other obligations? PCUMC offers electronic giving for those of you who wish to have contributions transferred electronically to the church's account. If you have plans to travel this summer, electronic giving gives you a convenient way to keep up with your intended offerings. Giving statements will be mailed in July to those who have us keep track of their offerings. These statements cover your giving through the end of June.

Thank you again for all you do to make our church ministries happen. We need to work hard to provide all the support they need, and your continued support will make our ministry a powerful witness to Christ.
