FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. -Philippians 4

Have you ever played the game Whack-a-Mole? It used to be in all the arcades. You would whack a mole with a club, and as soon as you knocked one down, another one would pop up. Years ago I took care of lawns for a living and moles were one of the hardest things to get rid of. Usually we would just try to get them to move to the neighbor's lawn. (But that doesn't work with loving your neighbor.)

For many of us life is like playing Whack-a-Mole. We just fix one thing in life and another problem pops up. Like a never ending struggle to try to stay even. The Bible tells us in Philippians 4 not to be anxious about anything. If we turn to God, He will hear our petitions and concerns and give us peace. So then why do we feel like we are playing Whack-a-Mole all the time?

Paul also says we need to be thankful. I think it's because we are not thankful and we are not seeking God's peace that we get anxious. For most of us, if we started counting our blessings before we ask God, we would not only realize how we are blessed, but also that many of the things we stress about are not as important as we sometimes make them out to be. If you won't even think about something in three weeks, it's not worth being anxious about today. And most of us simply have too much in our lives. God's peace doesn't come with more stuff, more prestige, more money, or praise. It comes with more of God. Paul also tells us in Philippians 4 that he knows the secret of contentment, "I can do all things through Christ who gives me strength."

The easiest way to beat the Whack-a-Mole game was to find a partner to hit the moles. In Genesis, "It isn't good for us to be alone, and we need a suitable helpmate." I think someone to help us along in life and getting rid of some of the moles, is what we can do, but listening to God, and trusting God, will give us some of that peace... Don't be anxious about anything.

THRIVENT CHOICE DEPOSIT

We are pleased to let everyone know that Pendleton Center UMC is now enrolled in Thrivent Choice®, and we have already received our first charitable outreach grant! Thrivent Choice is a member-advised program that allows eligible members to recommend where Thrivent Financial distributes part of its charitable outreach funds each year. A Thrivent Financial member nominated our church to receive grant funds; we were approved, and we recently received our first grant in the amount of \$2,726! These funds were applied to the Niagara Falls Community Dinners program, a ministry that carries out the religious and charitable purposes of PCUMC and Joshua Connection.

Dinners are held every Thursday evening to help those less fortunate from the LaSalle community of Niagara Falls. The weekly dinner provides an opportunity to bring the community together to share a meal, fellowship and worship. A new “congregation” has emerged from this mission to reach the least, the lost, and the little ones!

SUMMER BIBLE STUDY

Wednesdays at 7pm | July 11 - August 8

We will be looking at the book *Three Simple Rules* by Rueben Job, a bishop in the United Methodist Church in Iowa from 1984 until his retirement in 1992. In *Three Simple Rules*, Rueben Job offers an interpretation of John Wesley's General Rules for today's readers. This insightful work calls us to mutual respect, unity, and a deeper daily relationship with God. It takes a simple but challenging look at three commands, "do no harm, do good, and stay in love with God."

The book is \$6 and may be ordered by calling the church office or putting a note on your Friendship Card by Sunday, July 1. You do not need the book to participate, but we need to order on July 2 to get them here in time.

GRIEF SHARE

Your PCUMC grief support group has completed another series, but will resume in September.

If you, or someone you know, has experienced a loss (past or present) with which you or they are struggling, please consider attending the 13 sessions in the fall. There is no need to be alone in grief. Come by yourself or with a friend or family member.

The curriculum, GriefShare, is a faith-based exploration of loss and how it affects lives. It guides the group members through the many layers of grief with a goal toward understanding, growth in faith, and an ability, because of the experience of loss, to lend compassion and support to others.

The group is facilitated by Leslie Wagner and Sue Hilts. Meetings are on the 1st, 3rd and 5th Thursday of each month at 7pm. There is a fee of \$15 to cover a workbook for each participant. Watch for further information as September approaches.

We've been participating in Tops Markets' "Ca\$h for Causes" program for 12 years now! This program has earned more than \$26,000 for Pendleton Center Church with over \$524,000 in Tops cards sales! FINANCE MINISTRIES

How are we doing? This article was written in mid-June, when we only had financial results through the end of May. Our May year-to-date income was about 0.6% above the comparable figure last year, even though we had one more weekend of income last year through May. In addition, our income through May was much higher than our expenses. Our current income projections for the year are very close (within \$1,000 or 0.1%) of our 2018 finance budget. We will continue to keep a close watch on our spending and income levels. We appreciate your generosity in helping us to meet our expenses, as well as your special offerings toward our mission moments.

Electronic Giving - A Simple, Generous Choice: Would you find it helpful to have your offerings debited directly from your bank account as you probably do with other obligations? PCUMC offers electronic giving for those of you who wish to have contributions transferred electronically to the church's account.
