From the Pastor's Desk

Christmas is special. It's not just the food, parties, gifts, and decorating. It's not even the TV specials, cookies, eggnog, or Christmas cards. There is something about Christmas that brings out the best in us. Sometimes we get in arguments or stressed from too much, but usually we try. We try real hard to be better this season of the year. Let somebody into traffic, put something in the red kettles, give a gift to a needy child, hold back that biting remark, and smile. Elvis Presley once sang, "Why Can't Every Day be like Christmas?" It can be, and it's about gifts.

Gift giving is a part of Christmas. We enjoy seeing the person we give a gift lighting up with delight. It makes us feel good. Acts 20 says, "We must help the weak, remembering the words the Lord Jesus himself said: 'It is more blessed to give than to receive.'" So we give gifts, especially to the weak, and God lights up our hearts.

But the key to every day Christmas is in gift receiving. It can be hard to receive a gift. It makes us feel beholden to someone else, it makes us even feel a little like the weak, but sometimes the greatest gift we can give is to let others give to us and let God light up their hearts. Every day Christmas is about letting God give us His gift. John 3 says, "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son so that whoever believes in him will have eternal life." In John 14, Jesus says, "I will ask the Father, and he will give you another counselor to help you and be with you forever - the Spirit of truth. The world cannot accept him, because it neither sees him nor knows him. But you know him, for he lives with you and will be in you." When we accept the gift of God our heart changes, our lives change, and Galatians 5 tells us our heart will produce fruit of the Spirit: "Love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control." And if every day, every heart produced that fruit, every day would be like Christmas.



PRAYER & CARE

Respite Care

Attention all PCUMC adults! Faith-based respite care for adults is an important ministry providing relief to those caring for individuals living with Alzheimer's disease or other forms of dementia. A respite care program would provide time away from caregiving responsibilities one day each month for about four hours. There is grant money available right now, from the Ralph C. Wilson Jr. Foundation, to start such a ministry here at PCUMC, but we need your help. Volunteers organize programs involving crafts, music, physical activity, storytelling, and games. They relate one on one with our Alzheimer's guests while caregivers take a break. Volunteers also

provide small snacks and a simple lunch. This is a unique opportunity to reach out to our community and meet a real need. The program can be small or large in numbers depending on how many people are willing to commit to one, four-hour day each month. If God is tugging at your heartstrings to become involved with providing a safe, faith-filled environment for people in need so others can have a time of rest, contact Pastor Lisa or the church office. There is a tremendous need for this type of program in our area. We would be doing a great service to our community if God is calling us to start a program here. Please prayerfully consider what you can do.

Feeding the Homeless Monday, December 10

Fall Fish Fry Series 2018 Update

Thank you, thank you, THANK YOU to all who helped with our fantastic Fall Fish Fry Series. We served an average of 426 dinners each week, the highest average since 2009! Our profit estimate from the three October dinners is about \$7,300. These results are **fabulous!** Added to the record setting Lenten fish fry profit of \$31,833, our total 2018 fish fry dinner profit of about \$39,130 set another record, which is simply outstanding! All income from the fall fish fry series was applied to the General Operations account. You can see it takes many hands to provide the support our ministries need to be a powerful witness to Christ. It wouldn't be possible without all the generous help we receive. So again we say **many thanks!**
